I. BACKGROUND:

Taiwan Fund for Children and Families (TFCF) founded in 1950 who provides support to vulnerable children and their families and has its headquarters in Taichung, Taiwan. In 34 countries around the world, TFCF's vision and mission is aiming at promoting and advocating for the well-being of children, adolescents, and underprivileged families. TFCF in Vietnam has officially worked with Vietnamese and international partner organizations in Vietnam since 2014 through our 02 umbrella programs, i.e Sponsorship Program and Non-Sponsorship program which are all to support children, adolescents and disadvantaged families to have a brighter life and future.

PROJECT INFORMATION

Since 2020, TFCF has been implement activities to support the children in Da Bac district, Hoa Binh province via cooperation with Aide et Action and would like to extend to 02 other poorest districts among the poor in Hoa Binh province, i.e Da Bac, Lac Son and Yen Thuy districts. The percentage of poor households is 22.3% in these districts (2021). In addition to economic disadvantage, people here also face difficulties and deprivations in many aspects, especially in health care and medical issues. the most remote villages can be 10-20km from the nearest health station and the lack of financial conditions that make many people do not have the habit of having regular health check-ups, this can be dangerous if the diseases are not detected in time, leading to severe development, affecting the life and economy of patients and their families.

In addition, the local health stations/centers are limited in terms of human resources and facilities, making it difficult to meet the examination and treatment of serious and intensive diseases. Funded by the government, each commune has a health station with about 5-6 health care workers to take care of



thousands of people. Especially in the recent Covid-19 epidemic situation, these medical workers face a huge burden at work. In order to support the doctors and health workers, there is the village health worker system consists of people who have medical degree or short-term medical training to partly take care of the health of people in the villages. They can provide basic health services such as first aid, maternal and child health care. However, due to limited resources, village health workers do not receive regular training to improve their knowledge and skills and lack essential tools and equipment to carry out their work. Therefore, their work efficiency is still limited.

As a part of TFCF Non-sponsorship program, the health care project for underprivileged children and people in 03 remote and mountainous districts in Hoa Binh province will try to support children and people's health care and improve the quality of local health services.

The project's overall goal is: to improve equitable access of quality health care (HC) for underprivileged children and the population in 3 remote and mountainous districts of Hoa Binh province.

Project's results:

- Result 1: The quality of health care services for mothers before, during, after birth delivery and taking care of newborns contributes to reducing maternal and neonatal mortality in three disadvantaged districts are improved.
- > RESULT 2: The quality of health care services for women such as early detection of some common types of cancer in women (breast cancer, cervical cancer) is improved and timely intervention is made
- > RESULT 3: Reproductive health and sexual health for adolescents and young adults are improved
- > RESULT 4: Capacity building and provide equipment for health stations in disadvantaged areas to ensure health stations in disadvantaged areas are capable of providing technical services related to reproductive health care and child health care.
- ➤ RESULTS 5: Quality of child health care services is improved through periodic health check-ups, early detection for timely intervention, contributing to a reduction in the immortal rate of children.
- RESULTS 6: The health status of disadvantaged children in 03 targeted districts is protected & improved

Therefore, it is necessary to conduct an assessment to understand the barriers faced by different marginalized groups (included: ethnic minority, people with disabilities (PWD), women and children) in accessing healthcare services and health sector situation in Hoa Binh province to have better program design to ensure the project implementation that meet needs and demands of these mentioned groups.

II. OBJECTIVE OF THE RESEARCH:

 To identify the barriers that prevent marginalized and vulnerable groups (ethnic minorities, women, people with disability) in remote areas of the three districts in Hoa Binh (Da Bac, Lac Son, Yen Thuy) from accessing and using health care services and specify which of these are gender specific barriers and why.



- To identify service providers' perspectives on the barriers to accessing health care for ethnic minority groups, women, people with disability.
- To inform setting achievable targets for project indicators.

To attain the above

- Based on the assessment findings, to provide specific recommendations, including:
 - Recommendations for gender-targeted interventions to mitigate gendered barriers and thus improve access to health care services.
 - Recommendations for targeted interventions to mitigate barriers for people with a disability, CHILDREN, WOMEN and thus improve the delivery of equitable health care services.
 - Recommendations for targeted interventions to mitigate barriers for ethnic minority remote populations and thus improve access to health care services.

III. SCOPE OF WORK

The consultation will take responsibility for:

- Review project documents and other documents related to the study area.
- Design baseline study protocol including: methodology, sampling strategy, tools, analysis
 plan, field work plan and report outlines
- Provide training for quantitative interviewer team one day before field data collection.
- Conduct qualitative interviews on the field with TFCF team's support.
- Conduct data analysis based on the approval analysis plan.
- Develop presentation of key findings in ppt format.
- Writing final reports.
