I. BACKGROUND

1. Fauna and Flora International, Vietnam Programme

Fauna & Flora protects threatened species and ecosystems worldwide, choosing solutions that are sustainable, based on sound science and take account of human needs. Operating in more than 40 countries worldwide, Fauna & Flora saves species from extinction and habitats from destruction, while improving the livelihoods of local people. Founded in 1903, Fauna & Flora is the world's longest established international conservation body and a registered charity.

Fauna & Flora's work in Nui Chua National Park focuses on improving marine resource management through building capacity for local partners and supporting species conservation and sustainable community development.

2. Nui Chua National Park and My Hai Biodiversity Fund project

Nui Chua National Park (NCNP) contains notable marine biodiversity, particularly as one of the last marine turtle nesting beaches on the Vietnamese mainland, as well as coral reef, seagrass and mangrove ecosystems.

Fauna & Flora is implementing a pilot biodiversity microfinance fund, to promote nature-positive, climate-resilient enterprises. The Project would involve lending to such enterprises, prioritising sectors with tangible positive biodiversity and social impacts, and demonstrated demand for loan finance. Possible businesses that could benefit would include ecotourism, seaweed farming, and waste collection. The profits generated by the fund would be used to finance conservation activities such as MPA patrol costs.

II. OBJECTIVES

The main objective of this research is to gather baseline data on both the market context and the social context of the proposed product within the two coastal communes around NCNP. The studies are comprised of two components and the subsequent objectives:

1. Market research

- To identify a target market for the loan product.
- Profile the potential loan clients.
- Recommend suitable design for product including interest rates, based on market opportunities and ensuring balanced economic, environmental and social impact.

2. Gender and social inclusion analysis:

- To understand and identify gender-differentiated needs, risks, and power dynamics
- To understand how gender relations, social rules and hierarchies affect different groups of people's roles and access to opportunities and benefits from marine resources

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- To identify vulnerable and marginalised community groups to be targeted by the project
- To provide recommendations on project design and implementation needs to address these issues

III. DELIVERABLES

It is expected that the consultant team deliver the following outputs:

- A workplan with proposed timeframe, and research outputs approved by Fauna & Flora technical team
- Data collection tools (questionnaires, framework, tools, etc) designed for the research
