Fauna & Flora International

Fauna & Flora International (FFI) saves species from extinction and habitats from destruction, while improving the livelihoods of local people. Our guiding principles are to work with and alongside local partnerships, act as a catalyst for change, make conservation relevant, and base decisions on sound science. Founded in 1903, FFI is the world's longest established international conservation body; our conservation work, and impact, spans the globe.

Asia Pacific Programme

Working closely with local partners, the Asia-Pacific Programme currently includes a broad range of species and landscape targeted conservation initiatives in Vietnam, Indonesia, Cambodia and Myanmar, and has country programme offices in Phnom Penh, Jakarta, Hanoi and Yangon. Around 70 projects are being implemented in the region by a team of approximately 200 staff, consultants, volunteers and partner organisations with an annual regional budget of approximately USD 10 million.

Vietnam Programme

Vietnam supports a rich variety of wildlife and habitats, some of which is rare and found nowhere else in the world. Despite is relatively small size, Vietnam is the 16th most biodiverse nation on Earth. Vietnam's natural world includes some of the highest diversity of primates (apes and monkeys) in the world, with an incredible 25 species. Vietnam is also a global hotspot for plant, amphibian, reptile and bird richness and endemism.

The Fauna & Flora Vietnam Programme, established in 1997, is at the forefront of conserving this unique and threatened wildlife and we have experienced some significant successes especially in the recovery of primate populations. Our programme includes a focus on: species conservation; strengthening the protected area network and improving management effectiveness; conservation and connectivity at the landscape scale; supporting the wellbeing of local communities and enabling community-based conservation approaches, placing local stakeholders at the forefront of forest management, protection and monitoring; addressing illegal and unsustainable wildlife trade; and conservation of marine biodiversity.

- Manage Fauna & Flora's Vietnam Programme Facebook and Instagram accounts including creation and posting of approved content
- Lead all communication campaigns
- Support the development of additional online and paper communication content for posting and distribution
- Support the gathering information to update Fauna & Flora's website content and blogs
- Support the creation and distribution of media alerts, press releases, and photographs
- Prepare/arrange interviews with media, both national and potentially international
- Support to design products for sale which promote Fauna & Flora Vietnam's work and profile
- Assist Fauna & Flora staff to develop blogs, newsletters and media releases
- Help to create graphic/printed materials for all Fauna & Flora Vietnam communications and marketing materials. Find suitable suppliers and follow up to produce all of the communication materials, gifts, etc. and working on the other paperwork related
- Create videos for workshops, from the field clips and other purposes from all of the project sides
- Support different kinds of events on taking photos, logistics or assisting the Country Director
- Translation of materials relating to communications and marketing between English and Vietnamese
- Lead on designing and printing Fauna & Flora annual calendars

Conservation Outreach

- Support to develop awareness raising materials (posters and leaflets) and ensure they meet the needs identified, receive comments from Fauna & Flora staff and partners, attain a high level of production quality and meet Fauna & Flora's global guidelines
- Support staff to conduct conservation awareness raising activities, including local community awareness raising meetings, out-door environmental education activities for school-aged children
- Prepare short reports on conservation raising activities

- Undertake tasks in support of the Fauna & Flora Vietnam Programme that may reasonably be requested by Senior Management Staff
