Purpose of Activity/Assignment: To enhance the Child Survival Development and Environment's capacity to effectively respond to key commitments in the areas of nutrition response and recovery in emergencies.

Scope of Work:

Background:

Vietnam, as a lower middle-income country since 2010, is at critical juncture in its development journey, especially under the New Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) framework which provides a strengthened partnership platform for supporting Vietnam's efforts towards achieving key national priorities. With the increasing national capacity to invest its own resource for the development programs, UNICEF is increasing its role in upstream advocacy and technical assistance to eliminate barriers and bottlenecks across sectors including in the nutrition.

Since 6 September 2024, the Northen Mountain region of Viet Nam has been hit by the third storm, Typhoon Yagi. This is the strongest to hit Asia and Vietnam this year, which have brought unprecedented heavy rains resulting in landslides and cascading floods. The Viet Nam Disaster Management Authority (VDMA) has recorded that the Typhoon Yagi kills 318 people, 26 people missing and destroys homes across north of country as of 28 September 2024. The Government of Viet Nam organized rapid assessments to the most affected provinces and released a call for emergency relief and support. In the field of nutrition, UNICEF is leading efforts to support the government in nutrition preparedness, response, and recovery during emergencies. The key government agencies involved in nutrition activities include the Ministry of Health, the National Institute of Nutrition, and various Departments of Health. Interventions will prioritize the emergency prevention of micronutrient deficiencies among pregnant and lactating women and children under five, as well as the treatment of severely acutely malnourished children. Prompt action is essential to address the urgent situation of malnutrition and micronutrient deficiencies, thereby avoiding high recovery costs associated with their consequences.

Major Duties and Responsibilities

- Provide direct technical support to the province in implementing nutrition interventions provided by the nutrition sector (Led by UNICEF and the NIN)
- Facilitate timely nutrition analysis and input to the situation analysis and its periodic update made for effective programme planning, development, and management.
- UNICEF's response plan is effectively executed in coordination with all other sectors (WASH, child protection, health, education).
- Timely contributions to nutrition to enhance the nutrition component of the weekly/monthly update.
- Liaise with relevant local authorities and community leaders to ensure community participation and local ownership of the nutrition problems and interventions.
- Undertake field visits to monitor programme implementation and provide assistance to the field team as requested and travel to the field to fill gaps as required.



- Participate in coordination meetings with other agencies/INGOs in relation to nutrition in emergencie including planning, operations, coordination, and information sharing.
- In collaboration with the NIN, and the related provincial health offices prepare consolidated secto intervention reports by monthly and ending intervention phase and contribute to the donor reports.
- Consolidate the profile of typical SAM's cases on result of treatment from the 06 provinces of Norther provinces (Lao Cai, Yen Bai, Thai Nguyen; Bac Can, Cao Bang, Lang Son)
- Follow up with the NIN and provide technical support to the NIN in implementation of national Planning Workshop on formulation of the National Nutrition Preparedness Plan including formulation of sector guideline on nutrition emergency response.
- Follow up with the NIN and provide technical support to the NIN on implementation of the TOT training needed on Nutrition Emergency Response
- Follow up and provide technical support to the NIN in organize a national experience review meeting when needed on the result of emergency nutrition intervention.
