Background of this assignment

The MACIB project, funded by the Dutch Government, aims to transform aquaculture cooperatives in the Mekong Delta into sustainable, inclusive, and professional entities. It focuses on shrimp farming cooperatives, building their business models, improving sustainability, and promoting the inclusion of women and youth. The project operates in Tra Vinh, Soc Trang, Ca Mau, and Bac Lieu provinces, aligning with Vietnam's master plan for sustainable agricultural value chains.

The project supports cooperatives in overcoming challenges such as fragmented production, limited access to technology and financial services, and inconsistent farming practices. Through this effort, MACIB seeks to professionalize cooperatives, enhance their role in the aquaculture supply chain, and ensure inclusivity, particularly for underrepresented groups.

To highlight the key achievements of the project upon its completion in 2026, Agriterra intends to undertake a communication assignment to assess the current state of the cooperatives. This initiative will establish a baseline for comparing future positive changes and documenting these achievements to scale up successful outcomes.

Since communication is not Agriterra's core expertise, we plan to look for a consultancy service to perform this assignment professionally.

Introduction Cooperatives

Toan Thang Cooperative (Soc Trang)

- o Established in 2016 with 24 members, now grown to 72 members.
- o Toan Thang coop (Vinh Hiep commune), focuses on sustainable shrimp farming.
- It faces challenges in scaling operations and accessing modern farming technologies. Many members use partial PE pond liners or earthen ponds, resulting in lower yields and higher disease risks.
- The cooperative aims to adopt modern technology, improve governance, and strengthen its financial management to become more competitive.

Hoa Nho Cooperative (Soc Trang)

- o Operated since 2016, Hoa Nho has 53 ha of shrimp farms with 25 members.
- o Producing 3,012 metric tons of shrimp annually, the cooperative primarily exports to high-value markets such as the EU, USA, Japan, and South Korea.
- Growth is constrained by a small membership base, limited financial resources, and a lack of youth and gender participation. The cooperative seeks to improve operational efficiency and inclusiveness for long-term sustainability.

Phuoc Binh Cooperative (Tra Vinh)

- o Founded in 2020, Phuoc Binh has 18 members and emphasizes youth inclusion.
- It faces challenges related to access to financial resources and infrastructure modernization, especially in adopting lined PE ponds.
- With targeted support, the cooperative aims to enhance participation, improve productivity, and ensure sustainable growth.

Tai Thinh Phat Farm Cooperative (Ca Mau)

- Located in Tam Giang commune, Nam Can district, Ca Mau province, the cooperative focuses on semi-intensive shrimp farming.
- It faces challenges such as low productivity, inconsistent farming practices, and limited access to affordable inputs and advanced technologies.
- Tai Thinh Phat seeks to adopt aeration systems, biosecurity measures, and other modern farming techniques to improve yields and reduce disease risks.
- Strengthening market linkages with exporters and buyers is a priority to secure better prices and enhance financial stability for cooperative members.

Tan Phat Loi Cooperative (Ca Mau)

- o Based in Tan An Tay commune, Ngoc Hien district, Ca Mau province, Tan Phat Loi engages in both shrimp production and processing.
- The cooperative faces operational challenges in financial management and scaling its production efficiently.
- o It aims to adopt modern aqua practices and enhance value-added processing (e.g., shrimp crackers, dried shrimp) to penetrate high-value markets.
- With targeted technical support, Tan Phat Loi plans to streamline its operations, adopt sustainable practices, and improve access to export markets through certifications and stronger business partnerships.

Objective of the assignement

The consultant will:

- Capture high-quality photographs reflecting shrimp farming activities across MACIB-supported cooperatives.
- o Collect meaningful quotes and testimonials from farmers, cooperative members, and leaders.
- Develop engaging stories for each cooperative, aligning with MACIB's communication strategy and targeting key stakeholders, including government agencies, private sector partners, and donors.

Scope of Work

1. Photography and Visual Documentation

- Take high-resolution photos highlighting farming activities, governance processes, and cooperative development events.
- Ensure inclusivity by featuring women, youth, and underrepresented members involved in the cooperatives.

2. Farmer Interviews and Testimonial Collection

- Conduct interviews with cooperative members and leaders to gather insights on the challenges, experiences, and successes of shrimp farming.
- Collect quotes on key themes such as sustainability, gender inclusion, and the impact of the project on livelihoods.

3. Story Development and Writing

- Write well-structured, engaging stories for each cooperative, showcasing the positive impact of the MACIB project.
- Ensure alignment with MACIB's communication strategy, emphasizing sustainability, inclusivity, and cooperative governance.

4. Collaboration and Reporting

- Work closely with the MACIB project team to ensure consistency in messaging.
- o Deliver content in formats suitable for reports, social media, and websites.

Deliverables

- 1) Visuals: 20 high-quality photos/coop at minimum capturing various activities.
- 2) **Quotes and Testimonials:** At least three impactful quotes from each coop.
- 3) **Stories**: A story for each cooperative (5 in total) in both English and Vietnamese, ready for publication.


