- Raise awareness to other appropriate colleagues
- Empower children and young people to stay safe

Delivered by NCA-CEOP's child protection specialists and local subject matter experts, this course is designed to be a **practical training session** giving you both the **background knowledge** and **access to resources** to build into your own educational work.

Who can attend?

⇒ Anyone working **directly** with children and young people, to include but not limited to teachers, staff of children's charities and NGOs, social workers, government education professionals
