Dr. Neora Pick is an associate professor of Infectious Diseases, in the department of medicine at the University of British Columbia, Canada.

She works at British Columbia Women's Hospital and is the medical director of the Oak Tree Clinic, a family-centred comprehensive care clinic providing specialized care for women and children living with HIV. She has extensive experience in HIV care, and sits on the BC Centre of Excellence in HIV/AIDS Therapeutic Guideline Committee.

Dr. Pick is active in many areas of research focusing on women and HIV, including such areas as HIV and aging, HIV & bone health, and reproductive health, neurocognition, and HCV & HPV co-infections.

Dr. Pick's talk will provide an overview of HIV care in women, including specific HIV-related challenges and co-morbidities in women, that differ from men. Participants will have the chance to discuss how approaches to these issues in Canada may be applied to improve services for HIV-infected women in Vietnam.
