A two-stage procedure is utilized in evaluating the submissions, with evaluation of the technical components being completed prior to any price proposals being opened and compared. The price proposal will be opened only for submissions that passed the minimum technical score of 70% of the obtainable score of 1000 points in the evaluation of the technical component.

The technical component is evaluated on the basis of its responsiveness to the Term of Reference (TOR).

Maximum 1000 points will be given to the lowest offer and the other financial proposals will receive the points inversely proportional to their financial offers. i.e. $Sf = 1000 \times Fm / F$, in which Sf is the financial score, Fm is the lowest price and F the price of the submission under consideration.

The weight of technical points is 70% and financial points is 30%.

Submission obtaining the highest weighted points (technical points + financial points) will be selected.

Interview with the candidates may be held if deemed necessary.

5. Contract

"Lump-sum" Individual Contract will be applied for freelance consultant (Annex II) "Lump-sum" RLA will be applied for consultant assigned by firm/institution/organization (Annex III)

Documents required before contract signing:

- International consultant whose work involves travel is required to complete the course on Basic Security in the Field and submit certificate to UNDP before contract issuance.

<u>Note</u>: The Basic Security in the Field Certificate can be obtained from website: https://training.dss.un.org/consultants. The training course takes around 3-4 hours to complete. The certificate is valid for 3 years.

- Full medical examination and Statement of Fitness to work for consultants from and above 62 years of age and involve travel. (This is not a requirement for RLA contracts).
- Release letter in case the selected consultant is government official.

6. Payment

UNDP shall effect payments to the consultant (by bank transfer to the consultant's bank account provided in the vendor form (Annex V) upon acceptance by UNDP of the deliverables specified the TOR.

- 20% of the contract amount will be paid upon the submission and approval of the assignment workplan, which will also authorize the schedule of the field mission.
- 50% of the contract amount will be paid upon the submission and approval of the draft reports.
- The remaining amount will be paid upon the final submission and satisfactory approval of the final reports of the consultancy.

If two currencies exist, UNDP exchange rate will be applied at the day UNDP instructs the bank to effect the payment.

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

Project Title: Environmental Remediation of Dioxin Contaminated Hotspots in Viet Nam

Consultancy Title: Evaluation of Dioxin Project Impact to Environment and People

Contractual Modality: Individual consultant

Duration: 20-25 working days from April – 15 June, 2014

Duty Station: Home-based with a mission to Vietnam

1) GENERAL BACKGROUND

Viet Nam has experienced the worst dioxin pollution in the world. Large quantities of herbicides, most of which were contaminated with dioxin, were used in the armed conflict over the period of 1961-1971. The soil dioxin concentration in sprayed areas has declined to background level; however, a few sites at the airports where the herbicides, mainly Agent Orange (AO), were stored and/or handled are still highly contaminated. To date, dioxin 'hotspots' with contamination levels exceeding national dioxin limits (1,000 pg I-TEQ/g) have been identified on three airports that were used as military bases during the war, namely Bien Hoa, Da Nang and Phu Cat airbase.

UNDP has been involved in the AO area since 2005 and has supported the Vietnam Government to conduct surveys related to the assessment of dioxin contamination in the environment at 3 hotspots. Results obtained not only provide fundamental materials for design of a detailed remediation plan for Danang airbase, but also assisted with development of the National Action Plan to Overcome Consequences of Herbicides/dioxin up to 2020

The project "Environmental Remediation of Dioxin Contaminated Hotspots in Viet Nam" funded by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) through UNDP has been approved and launched since 2010. The objective of the project is "to minimize the disruption of ecosystems and health risks for people from environmental releases of TCDD contaminated hotspots". The project has three (3) main outcomes:

- 1. Dioxin in core hotspot areas contained and remediated;
- 2. Land-use on and around hotspots eliminates risks and contributes to environmental recovery, and
- 3. Strengthened national regulations and institutional capacities.

The project achieved the key following outputs after 4 years of implementation:

- Development of Remediation Master Plan for Bien Hoa.
- Complete interim measures to prevent dioxin release to the area surrounding Phu Cat airbase. 70,000 m3 of dioxin contaminated soil was contained safely and environmentally in 2011.
- Pilot demonstration of MCD technology at practical scale in Bien Hoa in 2012.
- Completed interim measures to prevent dioxin release to areas surrounding Bien Hoa airbase at the beginning of 2014.
- A number of communication activities and publications were prepared to provide information to the local people and stakeholders.
- Supported the Government on studies and issued dioxin guidelines for different land use purposes
- Capacity building on dioxin management for Government staff and others.

The Project is looking for a qualified international consultant to evaluate the Project's impacts to the environment and local people.

2) OBJECTIVES OF THE ASSIGNMENT

The objective of this assignment is to evaluate the Project's impacts and effectiveness of its activities to environment and local people.

3) SCOPE OF WORK

The consultant in cooperation with a national consultant and coordination with the project National Advisory Group will select a best approach to deliver the tasks below:

TASK 1. Collect and review all relevant project materials, related documents and data

TASK 2. Analyse and evaluate the project impacts and effectiveness of its activities to environment and local people

The **project impact and effectiveness of its activities to environment:** The international expert needs to develop a method/approach to evaluate the project impacts to environment throughout project's results obtained. Results of evaluation should include but not limited as following:

- + Project impact to environment (soil, water, ecology) at project sites
- + Its contribution to development on environmental protection of local and national and international
- + Environmental quality improved

Project's impact and effectiveness of its activities to local people: The international consultant will cooperate with national expert to design on evaluation of project impact to local people in deferent aspects (including health issue), and develop an evaluation questionnaire to gather quantitative and qualitative data. The international consultant will be responsible for final report on evaluation on project impact to local people.

TASK 3. Deliver a report on project impact to environment and local people that consist of (but not limited to) the followings:

- The Project achievement based on its designed outcomes and outputs
- Project's impact to environment: long-term and short-term
- Project's impact to local people including improvement of knowledge and safe health issues
- Project's limitations
- Recommendations

4) DURATION OF ASSIGNMENT, DUTY STATION AND EXPECTED PLACES OF TRAVEL

The assignment will require 20-25 working days with estimation of around 10 days mission to Vietnam for field trip to project sites (Bien Hoa, Phu Cat and possibly Da Nang) are required. Cost for the 10 day field trip need to be included in the financial offer of the consultant. The actual numbers of field trip day will be recorded and finalized at final payment stage of the contract.
