KEY RESPONSIBILITIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS

- Leading and conducting policy research and preparing information and analysis on public policy to inform CARE in Vietnam's current and future initiatives;
- Identifying, mapping and researching subjects to fuel meaningful discussions with stakeholders on the policy implementation and the development of CARE's impact groups;
- Working dosely with advisory team to ensure that policy research findings are well documented for advocacy proposes;
