The Asia Canine Protection Alliance (ACPA) is an international alliance of animal protection organisations formed by the Humane Society International, Animals Asia, Soi Dog Foundation, and Change For Animals Foundation, working to eradicate the illegal trade in dogs for human consumption – a trade which represents both a risk to human health by facilitating the transmission of rabies and impeding efforts to eliminate this disease in the region, and a severe and prevalent animal welfare concern in Asia. ACPA's focus is to end the trade of dogs from Thailand, Laos and Cambodia into Vietnam by tackling both the supply of dogs from Thailand, Laos and Cambodia, and the demand for dogs for consumption in Vietnam.

Position: ACPA Coordinator

Location: Hanoi Type: Full time

Term: Two years contract extendable based on performance with initial 2 months probationary period.

Salary: 520 – 730 USD gross per month with benefits

Position Responsibility:

Provide support in the implementation of the campaign to end the dog meat trade from Thailand, Laos and Cambodia into Vietnam within Vietnam in liaison with the relevant staff at Animals Asia, Change For Animals Foundation, Humane Society International and Soi Dog Foundation (SDF) (hereafter referred to as "ACPA"), to ensure the effective management and delivery of all campaign activities in Vietnam.

Key Responsibilities:

To work in collaboration with ACPA member organisations to:

- Assist in the communication with governments and other organisations to further the Alliance's campaign objectives in Vietnam.
- Develop relationships with external stakeholders and represent the Alliance to external stakeholders at all levels.

- Provide support to ensure the enforcement of the moratorium on the transport of dogs for commercial purposes from one country to another for 5 year period (as agreed to in August 2013).
- Manage media relations on behalf of the Alliance, including translating press releases and sending them to media sources in Vietnam, and conducting other communications as required.
- Liaise with key stakeholders to ensure the timely planning, development and implementation of all campaign activities in Vietnam.
- Assist in the representation of the Alliance to the public, actively raise awareness of the dog meat issue as well as the campaign, and mobilize members of the public to take action, in Vietnam.
- Serve as the contact and information point for the Alliance in Vietnam: updating the team with news and developments and equipping them with the tools they need to further develop and deliver the campaign effectively.
- > Conduct research as and when required, and ensure accuracy and clear references.
