The position supports the implementation of a campaign to end the dog meat trade and to ensure the effective management and delivery of all campaign activities in Vietnam. The position will require extensive travel within the country.

- A university Degree in relevant areas
- At least 5 years' experience working for environmental, conservation, or animal welfare organisations.
- Demonstrated experience in working with central and local authorities, especially in remote areas, and have a good understanding of how the legal system works in Vietnam.
- Experience or having a good understanding of the investigation process includes planning, evidence gathering, and interpretation of results.
- Experience in developing and implementing campaigns to change public attitudes in the environmental sector.
- Ability to communicate in the English language is essential.
- Excellent organisational skills, attention to detail, and an aptitude for problem solving.
