I. PROJECT INTRODUCTION

The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) Climate Resilient Agriculture in the Mekong Delta Project (CRM) is a five-year project working to enhance the resilience of the Mekong Delta's communities, ecosystems, and livelihoods. The overall goal of CRM is to advance low-emissions, climate-resilient, agricultural livelihoods combined with biodiversity conservation to support carbon sequestration, healthy ecosystems, and resilience of vulnerable communities in the Mekong Delta.

CRM works across five provinces of Dong Thap, Kien Giang, Ca Mau, Soc Trang, and Tra Vinh on three interconnected objectives and one cross-cutting theme:

 Objective 1: Strengthen climate change resilience of the most vulnerable populations. CRM will engage stakeholders to assess and address vulnerability through enhanced climate information services, resilient livelihood, and safety net models, improved provincial plans, and increased access to finance.

- Objective 2: Strengthen management and restoration of natural ecosystems
 to provide ecosystem goods and services. CRM will take an inclusive
 participatory approach to identify entry points to support evidence-based
 transformation of legal and governance frameworks, improve management
 capacity, and incentivize natural resource conservation.
- Objective 3: Reduce methane emissions through low-emission and sustainable agriculture practices. CRM will work with GVN and stakeholders across value chains to assess gaps and opportunities and harness payment for environmental services schemes and other results-based finance mechanisms to reduce intensive rice farming and GHG emissions and drive transformation through a market systems approach.
- Cross-cutting focus: Develop and implement policies to advance climate
 actions and biodiversity conservation. CRM will also work with GVN and
 stakeholders to enhance development, harmonization, and implementation of
 policies, as well as to strengthen national and sub-national coordination. CRM will
 engage key stakeholders to influence and incentivize policy, practice, and behavior
 in favor of transformation.

CRM will be implemented during the period of 2023-2028 by Winrock International with a consortium of Vietnamese and international partners. GVN counterparts are the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development (MARD), the Management Board for Forestry Projects (MBFPs), and Provincial Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (DARD) of five project provinces.

II. CONTEXT OF THE ASSIGNMENT

In 2021, Decision No. 553/QD-TTg approved the Project on Raising Community Awareness on Community-Based Disaster Risk Management (hereinafter referred to as Project 553), officially initiating its implementation across cities and provinces. Since then, Project 553 serves as a critical entry point for supporting the most vulnerable communities, particularly in the Mekong Delta, to mitigate climate vulnerabilities and enhance resilience. Therefore, CBDRM has been planned as a means of strengthening climate resilience agriculture-based livelihoods in five CRM provinces.

In December 2024, CRM organized the first training on Community-Based Disaster Risk Management (CBDRM) engaging as many as 50 officials and technical staff from the 5 CRM provinces. This training also highlighted the local need for more technical training and additional capacity-building activities to effectively implement Project 553 on the ground. Recently, CRM has also kickstarted a policy review on Community-Based

Disaster Risk Management (CBDRM)¹ to further strengthen climate change resilience among the most vulnerable populations in five target provinces.

To achieve goals and expectations of Objective 1, which focuses on designing interventions to address climatic vulnerability challenges, it is essential to identify the key policy and to fill the capacity gaps that hinder the provincial partners and communities in adapting to and coping with climate change. This assessment, therefore, will enable the local government to enhance their institutional capacity for raising awareness on and exercising Community-based Disaster Risk Management (CBDRM) practices that ultimately support the most vulnerable communities to be better adapted to climate change. Therefore, there has been a need for provincial capacity gaps to be identified, understood, and addressed.

Recognizing this need, CRM plans to hire a group of two consultants to conduct a capacity-building needs assessment on CBDRM in the provinces of Dong Thap, Kien Giang, Ca Mau, Soc Trang, and Tra Vinh.

III. DESCRIPTION OF THE CONSULTANCY SERVICE

1. Purpose of the assignment

The objective of this assignment is to assess the capacity of local individual authorities and organizational capacity in five CRM provinces to effectively implement community-based disaster risk management activities under Project 553. Specifically, it seeks to identify the capacity-building priorities and organizational development needs of these provincial institutions to enhance the effectiveness of 553 Project implementation.

Key question for the assessment is: "What kind of institutional capacities and organizational structure that the local partners in five CRM provinces need to implement the Project 553 more effectively?"

The assessment team is expected to gather data and information that will help clarify the following elaborate questions:

- Who are the key implementers and target beneficiaries of Project 553 activities and what are relevance and adaptability of capacity-building initiatives to the context of the Mekong Delta that they need to complete each component of Project 533? Which capacity building activities were already conducted and how effective were they?
- What are gaps in training, skills, exercises or technical assistance that are needed for local partners and communities to effectively complete the requirements of Project 553 in their specific conditions in the Mekong Delta?

- What are strategies for involving vulnerable groups (e.g., women, children, elderly, poor ethnic minority communities) and mechanism for integrating local knowledge and participatory approaches in the implementation of Project 553 in five CRM provinces in the Mekong Delta?
- How should local networks (local government, technical agencies, private sector, and communities) be organized to ensure effective implementation of Project 553? What kind of coordination and communication mechanism should be applied to the structures?
- What are the roles and responsibilities among the local governments, technical agencies, socio-economic organizations, private sector entities, and the most vulnerable community stakeholders in the implementation of Project 553 in five CRM provinces in the context of the Mekong Delta?

To summarize, the findings from this assignment will help CRM identify intervention entry points for planning process to support the local government partners and the most vulnerable communities to implement CBDRM activities, reducing the climatic risks and vulnerabilities as required by Project 553.

2. Tasks

In five months, this assignment will be performed through specific tasks as follows:

Design

- Develop a research framework outlining methodologies, a detailed work plan, and the process of how to undertake the assignment, including target partners, stakeholders, timeline, task division, and report structure.
- Present the research framework to CRM team to finalize the assessment approach, methodologies, and a coordinated field survey schedule aligned with the 553 Policy Review team to avoid overlapping meetings or redundant visits

Implementation

- Conduct desk review on the local capacity necessary for the implementation of Project 553 in five CRM provinces in the Mekong Delta, followed by an Inception Report and a technical meeting
- Join the planning process with the Policy Review consultant team to reach out to the local government partners, involving stakeholders and target communities for the field assessment
- Visit target districts and five CRM provinces according to agreed plan with CRM team to conduct institutional capacity assessment of the local government agencies and involving stakeholders in implementing Project 553 and other related activities. This process includes interviews, observations and multi-stakeholder

consultations with relevant local government agencies and representatives of the most vulnerable communities.

Analysis and Report

- Synthesize collected data with secondary sources to analyze the implementation status of the reviewed activities, compiling a report.
- Prepare case studies, local stories and other forms of evidence illustrated the analytical findings and incorporated in the report

Final presentation workshop and follow-up planning

- Present the findings of the local capacity needs assessment for Project 553 in a final workshop to validate the report and facilitate the development of a follow-up action plan with local partners and involving stakeholders.
- Provide inputs for the CRM Objective-1 team to draft the activity plan for FY26 and beyond.

3. Anticipated Level of Effort (LOE) and Deliverables

From January to May 2025, this assignment takes an estimated LOE of 65 (sixty-five) person-days, allocated to two consultants. The responsibilities for each role and deliverables are as follows:
